Library Funds Already Cut 20%

State funds for public libraries are indexed to tax revenue, which means that as they budget shrinks, libraries automatically get a smaller share of the state budget. Libraries are already doing their part to end the budget crises.

More Budget Cuts? 50% Cuts?

Governor Strickland has recommended the elimination of \$200+ million from the Public Library Fund over the next two years. This proposal by the Governor cuts state funding for libraries by 50%. These proposed 11 + million dollar cuts will be devastating: closing branches, halting new books and materials, and shutting down programs and services that are so vital to our community.
